

APPRENTICESHIPS Line workers make up a large percentage of WH's workforce and are an important asset to the cooperative and community. Line workers have the opportunity to train on heavy equipment and gain many skills. Their duty to keep power restored is a lifeline to the local economy. Graduates of Power Line Schools are generally hired to work as apprentice line workers. Apprenticeships last four years and include on-the-job training as well as correspondence coursework. The average first-year pay is approximately \$20 per hour plus a benefit package, with graduated increases through apprenticeship.

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EDWARD R. SLEBISKA MEMORIAL LINE WORKER SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM

When Wright-Hennepin (WH) was co-founded by Ed Slebiska in 1937, he played a crucial role in bringing electricity to rural homes and farms. He went on to become WH's first manager, holding the post until his retirement almost 40 years later in 1975.

Today, line workers continue to play a core role at WH in building and maintaining reliable power lines that serve members' homes and businesses. That is why WH is offering this scholarship in Ed's memory.

The purpose of the Edward R. Slebiska Memorial Line Worker Scholarship Program is to encourage men and women in the local area to pursue an electric line worker career. Two scholarships will be awarded annually, each in the amount of \$3,000.

Since the Line Worker Scholarship Program started in 2002 WH has hired several recipients as apprentice Linemen.

WHAT IT TAKES TO BEGIN YOUR LINE WORKER CAREER

Attend power line school for 10 to 11 months.

The college fee is approximately \$6,000 and the scholarship will cover half of your tuition.

ELIGIBILITY

Anyone who is at least a high school senior or older living within a 30-mile radius of Rockford is eligible to apply. Enrollment in a Power Line Technical College is required.

APPLICATION PROCESS

Scholarship applications must be filled out completely and returned to Wright-Hennepin Cooperative Electric Association, P.O. Box 330, Rockford, MN 55373 by April 25. To apply please submit the following:

1. A completed copy of this application form
2. Proof of local residence
3. Your future goals as defined in the questionnaire on the back of this form (attach additional pages if needed)
4. High school transcript
5. Post-secondary transcript if applicable
6. At least two letters of recommendation

HOW WILL THE MONEY BE DISTRIBUTED?

A committee will review all applications received. Two individuals will be chosen from the applicants and awarded a certificate for \$3,000. The money will be dispersed in a two-step process:

1. \$1,500 will be issued upon receipt of letter from your college verifying satisfactory academic standards and attendance record after the first semester.
2. \$1,500 will be issued the latter half of second semester of school, upon receipt of letter from your college verifying satisfactory academic standards and attendance record.

All information must be filled out completely on the application form.
