WRIGHT-HENNEPIN MEMBERS DONATE MORE THAN \$60,000 TO HELP LOCAL ORAGNIZATIONS

Rockford, MN (March 28, 2016) — Wright-Hennepin Cooperative Electric Association (WH) members who participate in Operation Round Up (ORU) donated grants totaling \$60,830 in February of 2016.

ORU participants allow their electric bills to be rounded up to the nearest dollar. The rounded amount is then used for donations to fund local programs. More than 80 percent of WH's members participate in the ORU program. ORU's board manages the generated money, which is held in a trust fund. Through a selection process and review of guidelines, the board evaluates funding requests on a bimonthly basis.

The ORU trust board approved the following donations on behalf of WH members for February 2016:

- \$2,000, Alzheimer Association, funds to support Alzheimer Association programs
- \$1,000, Annandale-Maple Lake Area Special Olympics, funds to support Special Olympic athletes participating in bowling
- \$1,800, Autism Allies, funds for a resource fair
- \$1,050, Boy Scout Troup #547, funds to support a scholarship for Grey Wolf leadership camp and Eagle Scout projects
- \$500, Buffalo Community Orchestra, funds to offset expenses related to concerts
- \$30,000, Food Shelf Donation, funds to replenish food supplies during MN Food Share Month in March

- \$200, Osseo Grad Party, funds to support an all-night safe party
- \$5,000, Pay It Forward Fund, funds for breast cancer victims to pay for utilities, housing, medical needs, transportation, phones or food


