WRIGHT-HENNEPIN MEMBERS DONATE MORE THAN \$22,000 TO HELP LOCAL ORGANIZATIONS

Rockford, Minn. (May 22, 2014) — Wright-Hennepin Cooperative Electric Association (WH) members who participate in Operation Round Up (ORU) donated grants totaling \$22,050 in April 2014.

ORU participants allow their electric bills to be rounded up to the nearest dollar each month. The rounded amount is then used for donations to fund local programs. More than 80 percent of WH's members participate in the ORU program. ORU's trust board of directors manages the generated money, which is held in a trust fund. Through a selection process and review of guidelines, the board evaluates funding requests on a bimonthly basis.

The ORU trust board approved the following donations on behalf of WH members for April 2014:
