CAR ACCIDENT CAUSES BRIEF OUTAGES

Rockford, Minn. (March 2, 2011) — A car accident that occurred at 7 p.m. on March 1 caused 2,300 of Wright-Hennepin's members to lose power.

The car hit a major transmission line causing both Howard Lake and Highland substations to lose power. The outage affected Albion, Chatham, Middleville, Marysville, Cokato, Victor, Stockholm and Woodland townships. In spite of the sub-zero temperatures, the Highland substation was back online in 30 minutes, and power was restored to the Howard Lake substation 25 minutes later. All 2,300 affected members had their power restored within one hour of the accident.
