Wright-Hennepin local school scholarship application



Wright-Hennepin Cooperative Electric Association (WH) and Wright-Hennepin Holding Company (WH Holding) are proud to provide scholarships to assist students of members in furthering their education.

WH Scholarship Program

WH began a scholarship program in 1988 and has since awarded almost \$687,000 to local students.

Money for the scholarship fund comes from unclaimed capital credits and donations from WH Holding, which provides the umbrella for WH Security, WH International Response Center and WH Services (WH Appliance Repair and WH Tree Services). By funding the program this way, the scholarship awards are not funded through members' electric rates.

Eligibility

High school seniors living in the local area are eligible to apply if they are planning to enroll full-time in an undergraduate course of study for the next academic year at any two-year or four-year college, university or vocational technical school in the United States.

Applicants must provide the following written documentation to be considered for selection:

- 1. Proof that your parent/guardian is a member of WH by providing a valid account number on your application.
- 2. The number and type of community service hours you have logged as an active member of your community.
- 3. A 150-200 word essay about why you should receive a scholarship from an electric cooperative.

Local school application process

Each year, WH sponsors one scholarship at each of the following public schools: Annandale, Buffalo, Dassel-Cokato, Delano, Heritage Christian Academy, Howard Lake-Waverly-Winsted, Maple Grove, Maple Lake, Monticello, Orono, Osseo, Parnassus Preparatory School, Rockford, Rogers, St. Michael-Albertville, Terra Nova, Watertown-Mayer, Wayzata and Wright Technical Center.

The schools listed above select their scholarship winner and have varying application deadlines. For your specific school's deadline, check with your guidance counselor.

To complete and validate your application the following items must be completed prior to submission:

- Application form
- Essay
- Current high school transcript
- Proof your parent/guardian is a member by including your account number on the application.

How will the money be distributed?

Scholarship funds are divided evenly among high schools within WH's service territory. Each school is responsible for distributing the money to recipients.

Scholarships will be paid by WH to your high school in December of 2024. Your school will then issue the WH scholarship payment to you.
