WRIGHT-HENNEPIN MEMBERS DONATE MORE THAN \$40,000 TO HELP LOCAL ORAGNIZATIONS

Rockford, MN (July 18, 2018) — Wright-Hennepin Cooperative Electric Association (WH) members who participate in Operation Round Up (ORU) donated grants totaling \$40,004 in June of 2018.

ORU participants allow their electric bills to be rounded up to the nearest dollar. The rounded amount is then used for donations to fund local programs. More than 85 percent of WH's members participate in the ORU program. ORU's board manages the generated money, which is held in a trust fund. Through a selection process and review of guidelines, the board evaluates funding requests on a bimonthly basis.

The ORU trust board approved the following donations on behalf of WH members for June 2018:

- \$3,500, Buffalo Community Theater, funds to purchase wireless microphones
- **\$2,000, Buffalo Food Shelf,** funds to provide free school supplies to school age kids
- \$1,100, Fishing Klinics for Kids, funds to support Fishing Klinics for Kids during Buffalo Days and other events
- **\$3,744, Homeward Bound,** funds to send four developmentally disabled people to summer camp
- \$1,500, Howard Lake-Waverly-Winsted Theater Arts Booster, funds to cover costs associated with the summer production of "Man of LaMancha"
- **\$8,500, Interfaith Outreach and Community Partners,** funds to prevent homelessness through emergency rent assistance and utilities payments during financial crisis

- **\$6,160, MidWest Region Wheelchair Sports,** funds to purchase two athletic wheelchairs for competitive basketball and a racing marathon chair
- **\$1,000, Rockford Friends of the Library,** funds to support community programs offered at the library
- **\$10,000, Wright County Community Action,** funds to support the energy assistance program


